October Smithsonian Saturday program at Cultural Heritage Center to focus on Sally Ride

PIERRE, S.D. – The next Smithsonian Saturday program at the Cultural Heritage Center in Pierre will be held Saturday, Oct. 1, at 2 p.m. CDT. It will focus on the effort to preserve artifacts and tell the story of astronaut Sally Ride.

The featured program is entitled, "Sally Ride: Curating Her Life." It was originally broadcast by the Smithsonian National Air & Space Museum on Oct. 6, 2015. There is no fee to attend this program, but regular admission fees apply to visit the museum exhibits.

The webcast is about celebrating the acquisition of the Sally K. Ride Collection of personal possessions and papers. The National Air and Space Museum presents a program focused on how Smithsonian curators seek to preserve the meaning of a person's life and legacy, particularly that of a woman who is considered an iconic national hero.

Tam O'Shaughnessy, Ride's partner in life and author of a new Ride biography, generously offered historians Valerie Neal and Margaret Weitekamp and archivist Patti Williams access to the papers and possessions of the first American woman in space. They discus stories, objects and documents that trace the full arc of Ride's life and represent her key achievements. They discuss the selected objects and papers that signify Ride, the public figure and private person, and how Ride's story intersects with social and cultural themes of her era.

"We are really excited to offer this program," said Jay Smith, museum director for the South Dakota State Historical Society. "Sally Ride is an iconic figure in the American space program whose story still provides great inspiration and character-building lessons."

The next Smithsonian Saturday will be held Saturday, Nov. 12. The program will feature work being conducted on historical topics in conjunction with the Smithsonian Institution.

The South Dakota State Historical Society became a Smithsonian Affiliate in January 2013 and is the only affiliate in South Dakota.
