The museum is currently open from 9 a.m.-4:30 p.m. CST Monday-Saturday and 1-4:30 p.m. Sundays. From Nov. 26 to Dec. 23, museum holiday hours will be 9 a.m.-6:30 p.m. and 1-4:30 p.m. on Sundays.
