May 7 Smithsonian Saturday program at Cultural Heritage Center to focus on American Art

PIERRE, S.D. – The Museum of the South Dakota State Historical Society will host a program from the Smithsonian American Art Museum entitled "Nineteen American Masterworks" with Art Historian William Kloss on Saturday, May 7, at 2 p.m. CDT in the Education Room at the South Dakota Cultural Heritage Center in Pierre.

There will be no charge to attend the program, and there is also free admission to the museum on those Saturdays.

The May 7 program, "Nineteen American Masterworks" was originally broadcast by the Smithsonian American Art Museum on June 24, 2015. The program features masterworks produced in the late 19th and early 20th centuries in America, which was a "coming-of-age" period in American art. Kloss explores the works from Gilded Age, impressionist, and Ashcan school painters.
