Remembering Betty Riggs Gutch

Betty Riggs Gutch of Sioux Falls, a good friend of the South Dakota State Historical Society, the Oahe Chapel Preservation Society, and the field of history in general, died on August 21, 2014. A descendent of the Oahe Mission Riggs family, Betty was instrumental in the preservation of the Oahe Chapel. She was a founding member of the Oahe Chapel Preservation Society and also served on the Board of Directors for a number of years.

Betty was born on December 20, 1919, the daughter of Robert I. Riggs and Florence Moseley Riggs. She grew up at the Riggs Ranch northwest of Pierre and attended country school through seventh grade. She then transferred to the Pierre School System, where she graduated in 1937 from Pierre High School. She received her Bachelor of Science in Business Degree from the University of Iowa in 1942.

Betty married Charley F. Gutch on June 15, 1943, at the family home in Pierre. Together they celebrated their fiftieth anniversary in 1993 and sixty-fifth in 2008. They lived in Pierre, SD; Lincoln, NE; Denver, CO; Salt Lake City, UT; Tucson, AZ; and Sioux Falls, SD as Charley continued his career in academic medicine at the various medical schools in these cities.

In later years, Betty became interested in the history of the Congregational Church (now called the United Church of Christ). She was on the Advisory Board of the Good Samaritan Center. She has been Chairperson of the Historical Committee of the SD Conference of the UCC, President of the Oahe Chapel Preservation Society in Pierre, and a member of the SD State Historical Society and has served on the Board of Directors of the Center for Western Studies at Augustana College.

We appreciate Betty's many years of service to the Society, and gratefully remember her commitment to the preservation of the Oahe Chapel. We send our deepest condolences to her family and friends.
