## Sprucing Up the Oahe Chapel, One Project At A Time

The Oahe Chapel will soon have a new roof, thanks in part to funding from the South Dakota State Historical Society's Deadwood Fund Grant program. The cedar shingle roof was damaged in a recent hail storm and required replacement. The Oahe Chapel Preservation Society's Board of Directors applied for a Deadwood Fund Grant, which was awarded in April. Local contractor Jim Wald has added our chapel to his schedule this fall. We greatly appreciate Mr. Wald's willingness to tackle this project and keep our chapel in good repair.

The Board of Directors is also preparing an application for an Outside of Deadwood Grant from the City of Deadwood to aid in the repainting of the chapel next summer. High winds and hail storms in recent years have taken a toll on the chapel's exterior. Sections of the siding need to be repaired or replaced, and the entire chapel needs a new coat of paint. The board anticipates that this work will be undertaken in the summer of 2017 if the grant is awarded. Please see the box at right for more about this project.
