## State Historical Society adds Farmers' Alliance member index online

PIERRE, S.D. – The South Dakota State Historical Society-Archives recently added an online searchable index listing over 17,600 names of dues-paying members of the South Dakota Farmers' Alliance from 1890-1894.

Volunteers created the database, using information found in two volumes, with 1,000 pages of data, from the South Dakota Farmers' Alliance collection held by the State Historical Society in the State Archives at the Cultural Heritage Center in Pierre.

"We are always thankful for the help volunteers provide to the archives," said Chelle Somsen, State Archivist. "It took almost two years and a large number of volunteer hours to create this database. The website will serve a dual role as a tool for genealogists and for specialists researching the range and influence of the Farmer's Alliance in South Dakota."

The Farmers' Alliance was an organized agrarian economic movement amongst U.S. farmers formed during the last quarter of the 19th century.

Information found in the index includes: Last Name, First Name, Post Office Address, County, Organization Name and Number, and the years dues were paid.
