## Photo Album of Rodeo Performers Donated to State Historical Society

PIERRE, S.D. – The South Dakota State Historical Society-Archives recently received a photo album of 163 postcards and photographs of rodeos and rodeo performers in western South Dakota from the 1910s-1920s.

Clarence E. Slider collected the postcards and personally took a few of the photo album images. Slider was a former manager at the Blue Bell Lodge in Custer State Park and was an avid horseman and cowboy.

Most of the images are of bronc riders (including a few female riders). Other images include bull riding, steer riding, bulldogging, trick roping, trick riding, horse racing and horse jumping. Some of the images feature horse jumps over automobiles.


"Mr. Slider's photo album is a real gem," said Chelle Somsen, state archivist. "A number of great collections like these are still found throughout the state and make an excellent addition to any archives, library or historical society."

The album images identify 49 male riders and nine female riders. Also identified are more than 40 horses with names such as "Skyrocket," "Fire Fly," "Dynamite" and "I-Be-Dam."
