

Mrs. Carl E. Anderson Rites Saturday at Brooklyn Church

Augusta Johnson was born Sept. 9, 1877, at Osterplana, Sweden, one of a family of eight children. She was baptized and confirmed in the State Lutheran church and grew to womanhood in that country.

In the fall of 1905 she migrated to America coming to the Beresford community, where she made her home with a sister, Mrs. Nordquist until June 26, 1908, when she was united in marriage to Carl E. Anderson. To this union were born a daughter and a son.

The couple engaged in farming and until 1945, Mrs. Anderson was very active. At that time she suffered a stroke and was hospitalized but recovered and again assisted her husband with the farming. In December of 1948 she fell and sustained a broken leg which necessitated a long hospitalization. After her recovery from this she was able to resume a part of her work and early this spring she suffered a second stroke and has since spent most of the time in the hospital.

Mrs. Anderson passed away late Tuesday afternoon at a Yankton hospital where she had been a patient since the middle of August. She had attained the age of 74 years, 1 month and 21 days.

Survivors include the husband, one son, Henning, and one daughter, Sophie, Mrs. Albert Reinartz, Huron; four sisters, Tikla, Sweden, Mrs. Signie Lykholm, Hibbing, Minn., Mrs. Anna Hedvald, Seattle, Wash., and Mrs. Regina Nordstrom Portland, Ore.; one brother, John of Sweden.

Funeral services were held Saturday, Nov. 3 from the Wass chapel and the Brooklyn church with Rev. Wallace Johnson and Rev. Virgil F. Bjerke, officiating. The services were under the direction of the Wass home for funerals.
