

OBITUARY

Theodor Reinartz was born at Scheuren Kreis - Daun, Regierungs, Bezirk Trier, Germany, on June 13, 1836, and passed away at Ethan, S. D., at 2:45 a. m., on August 20, 1931, at the home of his grandson, Ted Reinartz, at the advanced age of 95 years, 3 years, and 7 days.

In 1860 he was united in marriage to Margaret Mihael, and to this union was born ten children: —Katherine, Mary, John; Nick, who passed away about two weeks ago; and 6 who died in infancy. He leaves to mourn his departure: Mrs. Frank Young, of Ethan; Mrs. G. P. Grosz, of Parkston; John N. Reinartz, of Huron; besides 29 grandchildren and 55 great-grandchildren.

He came to this country in 1885, and settled in Rome township, Davison county, South Dakota.

Funeral services were held at the Holy Trinity Catholic church in this city, Monday morning, August 24, at nine o'clock, Rev. Father Eckl being in charge. Interment was made in the local Catholic cemetery, beside his beloved wife, who preceded him in her call seventeen years ago.

Mr. Reinartz was a kind and loving husband and father and a good neighbor. Though he came to America when very young, by hard work and thrift through the early days of pioneering, he accumulated a comfortable home and its possessions. He was a man of sterling character whose friendly deeds and kind words will be missed by all.
