Sioux Sanatorium Correspondence, 1937-1952. These records are housed at the National Archives, Central Plains Region, in Kansas City, MO and were microfilmed by the SD State Archives. Copies of this film may be purchased from the SDSA.

Arrangement of this series is chronological with the exception of the decimal correspondence which is arranged according to the local modification of the Office of Indian Affairs field service subject decimal code of December 11, 1925.

Included in the correspondence are letters sent to the Commissioner of India Affairs from the superintendents, and chief medical officers. The decimal correspondence consists of letters sent to and received by the agency superintendents, and medical officers. Of particular historical interest are: a *Sioux San Sun* newsletter for June and July 1948 containing a sermon written entirely in the Dakota Sioux language; two letters discussing the appraisal and purchase of Sioux Indian relics from J.A. Anderson in 1938; and two letters from Senator Francis Case concerning WPA construction projects on Sanatorium property. There are also files containing Department of Interior circulars and bulletins, and public relations files containing Bureau of Indian Affairs Information Service Public Notices.
