


South Dakota: Historic Preservation Data



★ Federal Historic Tax Credit Projects, 2005-2015

-36 approved projects in 14 cities/towns

-Total private investment of \$55,336,560.86

-The Federal Historic Tax Credit program is jointly administered by the National Park Service, the Internal Revenue Service, and the State Historic Preservation Office. It provides a financial incentive for historic property owners to rehabilitate their income-producing properties.

● Certified Local Governments (CLGs)

-16 cities/towns (Belle Fourche, Brookings, Canton, Deadwood, Elk Point, Gettysburg, Hot Springs, Huron, Lead, Mitchell, Pierre/Ft. Pierre, Rapid City, Scotland, Sioux Falls, Sisseton, Spearfish)

-Three counties (Clay, Codington, Minnehaha)

-One city/county combination (Aberdeen/Brown County)

-Local, State, and Federal governments work together in the Certified Local Government (CLG) Program to help communities save the irreplaceable historic character of places. Through the certification process, communities make a local commitment to historic preservation and may be eligible for small, matching grants.

▲ National Register of Historic Places, 2011-2015

-47 new or updated listings, including individual listings (such as barns, parks, theaters, commercial buildings, houses, churches, courthouses, and schools) and district listings (incorporating a variety of property types)

-Authorized by the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, the National Register of Historic Places is the official list of the Nation's historic places worthy of preservation.
